The outstanding and highest calling of woman is always that of wife and mother, and it would be unthinkable misfortune if we allowed ourselves to be turned from this point of view. — Josef Goebbels, German Minister of Propaganda in 1939.

We want to challenge and provoke; disturb our audience while we entertain.

One critic expressed his initial concern:

'Oh no, not another counter-culture theatre group, ranting dogma and chanting over-politicised cant' (Grimsby Evening Telegraph). But he later entitled a review 'MONSTROUSLY GOOD THEATRE', calling our performance 'moving, earthily funny, exhilirating, good musically, finely crafted and well acted'.
