# MONSTROUS REGIMENT THEATRICAL NOMADS SUMMER WORKSHOPS PART ONE - FOR NEW PLAYWRIGHTS

#### THEATRICAL NOMADS Part One

"We are the music makers
We are the dreamers of dreams;
We are the movers and shakers
of the world forever it seems."

O'Shaughnessy

Writers, like all creative artists, are nomads who journey constantly into the uncharted territory of the imagination. The first group of the workshops this summer is for the inexperienced playwright and will offer the basic techniques of the craft, to equip her for her own individual journey.

The workshops will be held on 14th, 28th and 29th of July and will

include a visit to a theatre on the evening of the 28th.

There are a maximum of 20 places and priority will be given to older women and disabled women.

MONSTROUS REGIMENT was formed in 1975 to make exciting theatre based on women's experience. It is our policy to provide opportunities and encouragement for women in all areas of the theatre, particularly writing. Besides our national touring programme we regularly hold workshops and rehearsed readings.

#### **PROGRAMME**

Saturday July 14th 10-1 FREEING THE IMAGINATION

This introductory session will be led by director Chris Bowler, using improvisation and theatre games to open up the mind to the boundless possibilities of theatre. There will also be an opportunity to discuss with her what a director looks for in a script.

Saturday July 14th 2-5 CHARACTER

With the help of three performers, this session will explore the creating of characters, their relationships and conflicts. It will also introduce subtext, i.e. what is happening beneath the surface. The day will end with a group feedback session.

During the intervening two weeks participants may wish to write a short scene to be read and discussed by the group. However, this is NOT obligatory.

Saturday July 28th 10-1 STORY AND STRUCTURE

A good storyline is everything! This session will deal with plots, sub-plots, major reversals, the building of dramatic tension, cliffhanging and climaxes.

Saturday July 28th 2-5 STYLE AND LANGUAGE

Finding a style and language to suit the content. This session will look at some of the styles used in contemporary theatre. The day will end with a group feedback session, followed by a visit to the theatre. (The play has not yet been decided upon, but the theatre will be totally accessible).

Sunday July 29th 10-1 CONSOLIDATION

How to use the information of the last four sessions in order to get you started. In this session there will also be a reading and discussion of any scenes written by group members.

Sunday July 29th 2-5 OPEN SESSION

The exact nature of the session to be decided by the group. It may include discussion, question and answer, practical information, networking and general feedback on the workshops.

A plantation in Jamaica, one hot Christmas Eve in the late eighteenth century. A slave uprising rages in the fields while, inside the house, the two protagonists reflect a different kind of conflict. The play explores the complexities of the power relations between two women, a black slave and her white mistress. In 1988 Monstrous Regiment with Nottingham Playhouse co-produced Island Life by Jenny McLeod. It subsequently toured Britain in 1989.

Jenny McLeod went to school in Nottingham and then to Beeston College, half way through A levels she took a gamble and gave up conventional education and sat at home writing for four years. During the four years she wrote her first play CRICKET AT CAMP DAVID, which went on to win first prize in Nottingham Playhouse's WRITING '87 and a subsequent production at The Octagon, Bolton.

There will be an opportunity for discussion afterwards.

Why does Moira remember her sixth birthday so vividly? She goes to see her sister, Frances, to find out, and finds out a lot more than she bargains for - and a lot less.

KAY TRAINOR has been writing for radio and television series for the past five years. "Bad Girl" is her first play for the theatre. The first draft was a monologue, and was only recently developed into a two-hander after workshops held in September with director, Anna Birch and actresses Tracie Bennett and Trish Kelly, who perform the reading today.

MONSTROUS REGIMENT was created in 1975 to provide a high profile for all areas of women's work in the theatre. The company has a strong commitment to new writing, believing it to be the precious lifeblood of a theatre which, given the present political climate, is increasingly under threat. We have a writer-in-residence, currently Tash Fairbanks, who runs a script reading service and numerous programmes of writers' workshops and rehearsed playreadings.
