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WENDY KESSELMAN (Writer)

'My Sister in This House' won the Susan Smith Blackburn Prize in 1981 and the first Playbill Award. Her other plays include 'Becca', a musical, 'A Tragic Household Tale', 'Maggie Magalita' and 'Merry-Go-Round'. Her plays have been produced at the Actors Theatre of Louisville, New York's Second Stage, the Brooklyn Academy of Music, the Kennedy Centre and in Ireland, Yugoslavia, Greece, Australia and Hong Kong. Her most recent play 'I Love You, I Love You Not', is currently in production at the American Jewish Theatre in New York.

She is a four-time winner of the A.S.C.A.P. popular award in Musical Theatre and has received fellowships from the McKnight Foundation, the National Endowment for the Arts and the Guggenheim Foundation.

MONSTROUS REGIMENT

Monstrous Regiment was formed in 1975 by a group of professional actors who wanted to make exciting political theatre based on women's experience; tired of seeing that experience marginalised or trivialised, we wanted to take it out of the wings and place it at the centre of the stage.

Over the years we have explored a wide range of theatrical forms including the epic, the straight play, musicals, surreal images, naturalism, cabaret....We have looked at women in revolution, in history, at work, at play; women mourning, women laughing.

The company has no Artistic Director. Company policy and artistic direction are decided collectively by a group which currently consists of five women. Monstrous Regiment is a member of the Independent Theatre Council and is funded by The Arts Council of Great Britain.


